

## General Meeting of the Democratic Party of Bulloch County September 18, 2018

The Democratic Party of Bulloch County met September 18, 2018, in the headquarters at 18 North College. Chair Jessica Orvis convened the meeting at 12:13 p.m. with 15 present.

Minutes from the previous meeting were distributed. The report of Treasurer Don Armel was presented showing a profit of \$1,269.27 from the Gala and a current balance of \$5,700.37. The Treasurer's details of the expenses and recommendations for future Galas are available. Michael Woody moved to accept the reports and Connie Johnson seconded the motion.

The Treasurer suggested a motion to transfer the \$214.19 received from the Statesboro High School Young Democrats, no longer active, to the Young Democrats at Georgia Southern. In his absence Dahlia Newton offered the motion and Elizabeth Malloy seconded.

Signup sheets for poll watching and headquarters operation were circulated.

Woody moved to transfer the remaining funds donated by the party to the March for Our Lives to the Young Democrats, \$100, and the Indivisibles, \$47. Eduardo Delgado seconded.

Johnson reported that some 3,000 postcards were being mailed by the Indivisibles to help get out the vote.

The meeting was turned over to Yvette McCall from the Francys Johnson campaign for canvassing information and a demonstration of what might be expected in the field. She noted other volunteer opportunities and gave her phone number for those with suggestions for events in which the campaign could participate.

In closing announcements, Liz Johnson encouraged attendance at the Women Win Elections Summit, and Delgado reported that the Young Democrats will be at the GSU rotunda for voter registration. Sarah Riggs Amico, candidate for Lieutenant Governor, will be in Statesboro Oct. 11, and further announcements will be forthcoming about support for her visit and that of Stacey Abrams, expected in the second week in October.
